Green economy (in its broad sense), represents an enabling environment for people empowerment. Generally speaking, such orientation is often accompanied by a deep involvement of active citizens and entrepreneurs sensitive to "greener" choices in environmental issues, natural hazards management included. We can quote the Blue-Green Network Concept (with green infrastructures) in the case of the Lodz-PL Learning Alliance; policies to move from post-industrial to environmental sustainability in Auges-tenburg/Malmö-SE; greenhouses in Delft-NL; households' greener choices in Salford-UK.
